Pointe shoes: you thought they were made from wood right?!

They're actually traditionally made from layers of fabric, paper and cardboard, hardened with a special glue-like paste - a bit like papier maché. The outside is covered in satin and the sole is made from cardboard and leather.

It takes years of training before a dancer can go 'en pointe' as you need build enough strength in your feet and body to be able to hold yourself up on your toes - the shoes help - but they can't do it all!

The shoes soften the more you use them - a professional dancer can go through several pairs of pointe shoes in just one performance!
